Pre Questions

- 1. When you hear the phrase "from plan to purpose," what personal experiences or thoughts come to mind?
- 2. How has the concept of moving from your own plans to embracing God's purpose played a role in your spiritual journey?

QUESTIONS

THE CROWD (JOHN 12:12-13)

- 1. The crowd welcomed Jesus with palm branches, expecting a political savior. How do our expectations of Jesus sometimes differ from who He truly is?
- 2. In what ways can we align our expectations with the true nature and mission of Christ?

THE HERO (JOHN 12:14-15)

- 3. Jesus enters Jerusalem on a donkey, symbolizing peace rather than conquest. How does this choice reflect the kind of hero Jesus is?
- 4. What does this teach us about the nature of God's purpose compared to human plans?

US (JOHN 12:16-19)

- 5. The disciples did not understand these things at first but later realized their significance. How have you experienced moments where God's purpose became clear only in hindsight?
- 6. How can we cultivate trust in God's purpose, even when it doesn't align with our immediate plans?

Application Questions

- 7. Identify areas in your life where your personal plans may be overshadowing God's purpose. What steps can you take to surrender those plans to Him?
- 8. How can our church community support one another in discerning and embracing God's purpose over our own plans?
- 9. What practical actions can you take this week to live out God's purpose, even if it challenges your personal expectations?
